PUBLIC SERVICES OMBUDSMAN (WALES) BILL

I am pleased that the Assembly agreed to the general principles of the Public Services Ombudsman (Wales) Bill on 21 March 2018 and I am grateful for your Committee's work on scrutinising the Bill.

Timetable

In September 2017, the Business Committee considered the timetable for the Bill and agreed a provisional deadline of 18 May 2018 for Stage 2 proceedings. However, as Stage 2 proceedings rely on the Government bringing forward a financial resolution before your Committee can consider amendments, I have written to the Business Committee requesting an extension to the Stage 2 deadline. I have attached a copy of my letter for your information and I will keep you updated on this issue.

Inclusion of the Wales Audit Office in Schedule 3

You may recall the Auditor General for Wales (AGW) raised the issue of removing the Wales Audit Office (WAO) from Schedule 3 of the Bill. I replied to the AGW (and copied the letter to you) saying that, as the Bill had been introduced, it was a matter for your Committee to consider as part of Stage 1 scrutiny but, should evidence support the removal of the WAO, I would consider bringing forward an amendment. However, the Stage 1 report was silent on this issue.



As way of background, the WAO is not currently included in the Public Services Ombudsman (Wales) Act 2005. Following consultation on the draft Bill by the Finance Committee of the Fourth Assembly, Pembrokeshire Coast National Park and Brecon Beacons National Park Authority (in a joint submission) suggested the WAO's inclusion, and it was subsequently added to the Bill that was introduced.

Before deciding whether to bring forward an amendment on this issue, I would be keen to hear whether your Committee considered this matter as part of your Stage 1 deliberations.

TIMETABLE FOR PUBLIC SERVICES OMBUDSMAN (WALES) BILL

In September 2017, the Business Committee considered the timetable for the Public Services Ombudsman (Wales) Bill and agreed a provisional deadline of 18 May 2018 for Stage 2 proceedings.

The Equality, Local Government and Communities Committee's ability to undertake Stage 2 proceedings relies on the Government bringing forward a financial resolution prior to Stage 2 proceedings. Standing Order 26.74(i) requires a financial resolution to be tabled within six months of the completion of Stage 1. As the Assembly agreed the general principles of the Bill on 21 March 2018, the deadline for tabling the financial resolution is 21 September 2018.

On this basis, the provisional deadline for Stage 2 proceedings previously agreed by the Business Committee may need to be extended. I will need to have further discussions with the Cabinet Secretary for Finance in order to establish the amount of additional work which needs to be undertaken in order to satisfy the Government and in order for them to bring forward the financial resolution.

Therefore, I will write to the Business Committee with a new proposed timetable following the outcome of those discussions. I am copying this letter to John Griffiths, Chair of the ELCG Committee, due to the implications this timetable change has on the work of that Committee.

Committee inquiry into pregnancy, maternity and work

The Equality, Local Government and Communities Committee is currently undertaking an inquiry into pregnancy, maternity and work. As part of this inquiry, we are considering whether the Welsh Government's new childcare offer is matched with targeted support for mothers to enter or return to work. Given that the childcare offer falls within the remit of the Children, Young People and Education Committee, I wanted to draw your attention to our work in this area.

The [public consultation](#) to inform our inquiry has now come to an end. We are in the process of taking oral evidence from a range of witnesses and have sessions scheduled with relevant Ministers, including the Minister for Children and Social Care, on 9 and 23 May 2018.

I am aware that your Committee has recently begun its scrutiny of the Childcare Funding (Wales) Bill and is due to report at the beginning of July 2018. While we have yet to agree a timeline for the publication of our inquiry report, we will be happy to share with you any emerging issues which may be of interest to you in your scrutiny of the Bill.
